

ALEBRIJE-INSPIRED ART

Alebrijes are brightly colored Mexican folk art sculptures of fantastical (fantasy/mythical) creatures. The first alebrijes originated with Mexico City artisan Pedro Linares. Alebrijes often have exaggerated body parts, such as long ears or big eyes.



Draw an outline of a rabbit or any other animal!



Turn your animal into a fantastical creature! Add repetitive colorful dots, lines, and shapes. Make the ears longer or add parts from other animals such as wings or antennae.

Make your animal come alive as a puppet. Simply cut it out and tape it onto a straw or stick. Create and tell a story about your newly invented animal. What is its name? What special powers does it have? What does it like to eat? Where does it live?

MAKE A TREAT FOR YOUR PET!

Bake a healthy snack for your dog or chicken!

INGREDIENTS

(makes 12 pupcakes)

For the cakes:

1 1/2 cups all purpose flour 1/2 tsp cinnamon 1 tsp baking soda 1/2 tsp baking powder pinch of salt 2 Tbsp coconut oil melted

2 Tbsp applesauce

1 cup plant-based milk (such as oat milk)

1 tsp apple cider vinegar

1 cup pureed vegetables (pumpkin, sweet potato, carrots)

1/2 cup maple syrup

For the icing:

4 oz vegan cream cheese 1/4 cup peanut butter

INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat oven to 350°F.

Put all ingredients in a blender and mix.

Pour dough into cupcake pan lined with baking paper cups.

Bake for 15-20 minutes. Cool cupcakes on cooling rack.

Meanwhile, mix the vegan cream cheese and the peanut butter together. Once the cupcakes are cool, put icing on top using a pastry bag with a

decorative tip (if you don't have one, you can spread it with a small spatula). Enjoy with your pup!
