## **Children's Discovery Museum of San Jose and Stanford Flu Crew Offer Creative Vaccination Clinics for Children Ages 6 Months and Up**

*Support from Anthem Blue Cross aims to increase the number of vaccinated infants and children by providing support for busy families with a free museum visit for any person who gets vaccinated at the iconic Purple Museum*

San Jose, CA – July 28, 2022 - Children's Discovery Museum has teamed up with Stanford Flu Crew to administer COVID-19 vaccinations for the last eligible group - children ages 6 months and up. The first clinic is scheduled for Saturday, August 6, from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and on Sunday, September 11, from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at the beloved institution in downtown San Jose. The clinics are open to all eligible people aged 6 months and up for first and second doses and booster shots for eligible people five months after their last dose.

With funding from Anthem Blue Cross, every family whose child or adult gets vaccinated will receive a family pass ([FREE MUSEUM VAXPASS](#)) for a free museum visit. Families can use the pass the day of their vaccination or return by January 29, 2023.

"Building on the success of our winter and spring clinics, we're pleased to partner with Stanford and are grateful for funding from Anthem Blue Cross to help families get their infants and young children vaccinated. Parents are busy and we want to help," said Joey Sanchez, director of marketing and communications at Children's Discovery Museum. "These clinics offer parents the opportunity to get their child vaccinated and enjoy a free visit to the museum. We're also proud to play a role in vaccination equity by reaching out to underserved and non-English speaking communities."
